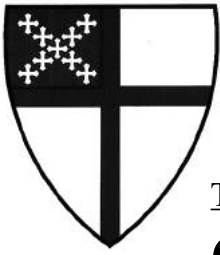

# Meditations

## Read: James 3:1-12

James 3: 7 *All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and creatures of the sea are being tamed and have been tamed by man, 8 but no man can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison.* NIV

I grew up in a household where my mother often used to say, "If you can't say something nice about a person, then don't say anything." I can honestly say in all my youth I never heard my mother say anything that would have been considered anything but nice. One would think with that upbringing that I would have been trained properly to be the same. Oh, how I wish it were so.

When I was young my tongue was a regular quiver of arrows with poison tips. Even as I grew older it did not seem to get any better. There are countless times when I wish I could capture the words before they left my lips but sadly enough I was caught in the snare of my own thoughts as well. As I have grown older, I have become more aware of the danger and try to choose my words before I speak but sometimes the words still come out before I put proper phrase to them.

As I have grown older and have developed a closer relationship with my Lord, I have tried to be more careful. The good thing is that when I slip the Holy Spirit is right there to convict me. How sweet it is to be convicted by the Spirit. Then I am aware and can make proper confession and try my best to correct the wrongs I have done. It is never easy, and I have been on the receiving end as well so I know how cutting vocal words can be.

The saddest part of this is that it has also a contagious effect. If someone sends darts my way, I am apt to want to send darts back. It also works the other way as well. You know that you have learned some control when you can receive and not respond in like manner. What I have found that really works best for me when faced with a situation is to pray a quick prayer for help from God and take a moment before speaking. I think James captures this best in chapter one verse 19 when he says, "Remember this my dear brothers; be quick to listen but slow to speak and slow to rouse your temper."

*Pray: Father God, help me to take the time to think before speaking in all situations. My tongue lashes out where I do not want to go. Help me that I might remember it is your creation that I communicate with and need to be mindful that what I say and do to others I do to you. Help me to know and do the right thing and let me honor your Holy Name before all those I communicate with that they may see your light and your glory. Amen*

ing your work. -- Barbara



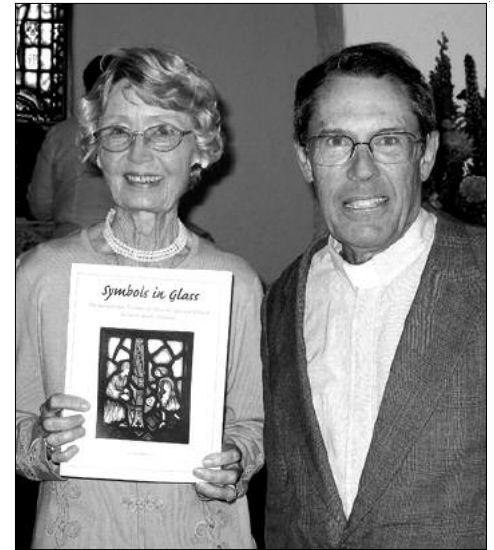

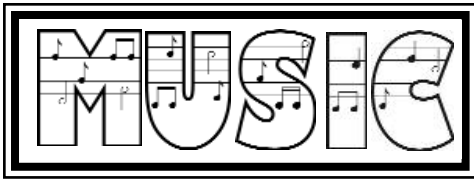
